Jackie said she would like help with the Bee Sign Project. Specifically, she would like volunteers to keep records, do drop offs of the signs, do outreach. Elaine suggested having a speaker in the Spring to talk about bee-friendly plants. Zia will contact someone from the garden club in Maplewood as a possible resource for a speaker etc.

Additional topics

Tom gave an update on the family education group. Aidan organized a Secret Santa among the families. They are planning to get together on Zoom to share the experience of opening the gifts together.

Zia spoke about the YES program, Youth and Ethical Societies. Tom forwarded information to Jasper and Aidan about this program, who both expressed interest. There will be an all-society YES platform in early March. Aidan is planning to participate.

Tom talked about wanting to check up on members we hadn't seen recently. Lisa and Elaine offered to reach out to try to get updates on the status of some of these members.

Bill Stoever has come out with a book about his travels. Elaine will ask him if he would be interested in speaking about the book at a platform.

Tom talks about new ways to promote, present and expand on platforms while we are all virtual. Some ideas included:

- YouTube videos by the presenter to precede a talk(e.g., doing a reading from a book), or sending out information, websites, links, readings, etc., to introduce members to the topic
- Following up with a later discussion and/or a Q&A
- Meeting on another day, possibly with breakout groups, to discuss some of the ideas presented in the talk.

Tom and Elaine will work on implementing some of these ideas in January or February.
